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MADISON CHILDREN'S MUSEUM TO HOLD SPRING BREAK ENERGY CAMP

MADISON, Wis. – Madison Children's Museum will hold an "Earth Source Energy" Camp on April 2 – 5, 2007 from 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. each day for children in grades 3 – 5.

This spring break camp will explore the ways people and businesses meet their energy needs, new research on renewable energy sources, and action steps kids can take to reduce their impact on Earth's natural resources.
