

Ships, Ahoy!

GREEN BAY—A dozen tall ships breeze into Leicht Memorial Park for the Aug. 13–15 **Baylake Bank Tall Ship Festival**, an international port-to-port race with six stops, stretching from Toronto to Duluth, Minnesota.

Board the docked ships, hear tales of their adventures and learn how tall sailing ships represent an ecofriendly form of transportation.

Sporting those billowy sails are accurate re-creations of historically significant schooners, such as the *Bounty*, from the 1962 movie *Mutiny on the Bounty*, and *Unicorn*, built in 1947 from pieces of German U-Boats.

Consider the colorful vessels fun, floating classrooms with multiple lessons to share.

The tripling of museum size means more room to amuse and educate a wider range of ages. Exhibits, and the kid-friendly cuisine at Bean Sprouts café, entertain ages up to 12.

Inside, Possible-opolis invites brainstorming about the interactions of art and science. And on the rooftop terrace—called a “four-season park in the sky”—the clubhouse and gardens provide room to run.
